Emmaus

In most surviving manuscripts of The Gospel According to Luke, the village of Emmaus is set at 60 *stadia** from Jerusalem. However, a number of key ancient manuscripts say 160 *stadia*. This discrepancy presents a problem. In Luke's account the two disciples walked both there and back within one day – which makes the 60 *stadia* figure much more likely. Unfortunately, there was no village by that name within 60 *stadia* of Jerusalem. The only village with a similar name was Emmaus N

icopolis which was actually about 160 *stadia* away (in an area known today as Canada Park**) which makes a one day walk highly unlikely.

- * The main Roman unit of distance was the *stadion* named after the length of a standard sports arena. In modern units it was approximately 185 metres, or 607 English feet. Thus, 60 *stadia* would be about 11 km, or 7 miles while 160 *stadia* would be about 30 km, or 19 miles.
- ** Canada Park has an interesting and controversial history of its own. Located on a strategically important 'corner' of the West Bank, Jordanian artillery used this area to shell the Jerusalem Road. After the 1967 war Arab residents of *Imwas* (Emmaus) were expelled (with compensation) and the entire area was turned into a park spearheaded by funding from Canadian Jews. Hence, the name.
